ADDITIONAL CARCINOGENICITY INFORMATION

From the studies available it is concluded that kojic acid is a non-genotoxic carcinogen in rodents. For the thyroid tumour induction a tumour promoting effect based on hormonal disruption is obvious. The goitrogenic (thyrotropic) effect is linked to inhibition of iodine uptake, a subsequent decrease in serum T3/T4 levels followed by a compensatory increase in TSH release with the consequence of thyroid cell proliferation. In contrast to rodents an increase in TSH in humans does not pose a significant concern regarding potential thyroid carcinogenesis in humans. Despite these comments, a threshold on the basis of hormonal disruption can be
